**Purpose:**

The purpose of this filing is to, based on recent discussions with the Water Division, revise tariffs so that “Residential Fire Sprinkler System (RFSS)” is changed to “Residential Fire Protection Service (RFPS)”

**Background:**

On January 26, 2006, Kevin Coughlan, Director of the Water Division of the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), issued a memorandum that authorized all Class A Water Utilities to offer a special rate for customers who need a larger meter because they have a fire sprinkler system. This memo also authorized Water Utilities to file an advice letter requesting a special rate for customers who will be required/requested to install a Residential Fire Sprinkler System (RFSS) to meet local fire requirements.

On February 18, 2010, the California Fire Marshal published a bulletin that adopted new standards for Residential Fire Sprinkler Systems as outlined in the 2010 California

Residential Building Code, Section R313. These new standards were made effective January 1, 2011.

Advice Letters 894, 898, 899, 906, 907, and 909 authorized California American Water to establish RFSS rates for qualifying customers.

**Request:**

California American Water requests approval to change tariffs to reflect RFPS rather than the current RFSS. This request is based on recent discussions between California American and the Water Division. During those discussions, which were initiated by the Water Division, it was recognized that changing RFSS to the more inclusive RFPS could benefit customers by including additional types of fire protection services in the tariffs.

**Tier Designation:**

Pursuant to G.O. 96-B, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

**Effective Date:**

California American requests an effective date of October 12, 2017.

**RESPONSE OR PROTEST<sup>1</sup>**

Anyone may submit a response or protest for this AL. When submitting a response or protest, **please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.**

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A **protest** objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds<sup>2</sup> are:

1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.
7. A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

Franchise taxes in the Baldwin Hills District are 2.00% per customer on a monthly basis.
3. Per Advice Letter 1072, a surcharge of \$0.0039 per hundred gallons will be applied to each bill to fund conservation efforts. The surcharge will remain in effect until otherwise directed by the Commission.
4. Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) and Modified Cost Balancing Account (MCBA) Surcharges.
  - a. **Baldwin Hills:**
    - i. For the Baldwin Hills service area, a surcharge is included on each bill to recover the net under-collection in the WRAM and MCBA of \$631,749, including interest, as of December 31, 2016. The surcharge is \$0.0406 per 100 gallons and will remain effective for 18 months beginning March 31, 2017.
  - b. **Duarte:**
